

“Who are the people who help us?”

Phonics

We will be continuing to learn to recognise, read and write digraphs- two letters which make one sound, such as ur, ow, or and oi.

We will continue to develop reading skills using the knowledge of phonics we have built up so far and will discuss what we have read with others.

We will continue to learn to read common exception words – Red Words (which don't follow the phonic pattern).

Expressive arts and design

Through painting, drawing and junk modelling we will explore, use and refine a variety of artistic effects to express their ideas and feelings.

The children will return to and build on their previous learning, refining ideas and developing their ability to represent them.

They will learn to create collaboratively, sharing ideas, resources and skills.

Physical Development

Developing fine motor control to develop the muscles in the hand and arm. Continuing to learn to hold a pencil correctly and learn the correct sequence of movements to write letters correctly.

Coach Bob will continue our football skills sessions.

Our outdoor play will encourage the children to move confidently in a range of ways, safely negotiating space. We will learn to combine different movements with ease and fluency.

Sing counting rhymes and songs.

Counting forwards to 10 and backwards from 10

Recognise all numbers to 10

CLL/Literacy

We will be reading stories about characters who help others. Some of our books are 'The Selfish Crocodile' and 'Six Dinner Sid'.

We will be using these books to develop our role playing, understanding of story and characters and inspire the children to write their own simple stories.

The children will be developing their ability to write simple sentences which can be read by themselves and others. Some words will be spelt correctly and others phonetically plausible.

Understanding of the world:

Understand the effect of changing seasons on the natural world around them.

Describe what they see, hear and feel whilst outside.

Recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways.

Understand that some places are special to members of their community.

Recognise some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

See themselves as a valuable individual.

Build constructive and respectful relationships.

Express their feelings and consider the feelings of others.

Manage their own personal hygiene needs.

Know and talk about the different factors that support their overall health and wellbeing including sensible amounts of 'screen time'.
