

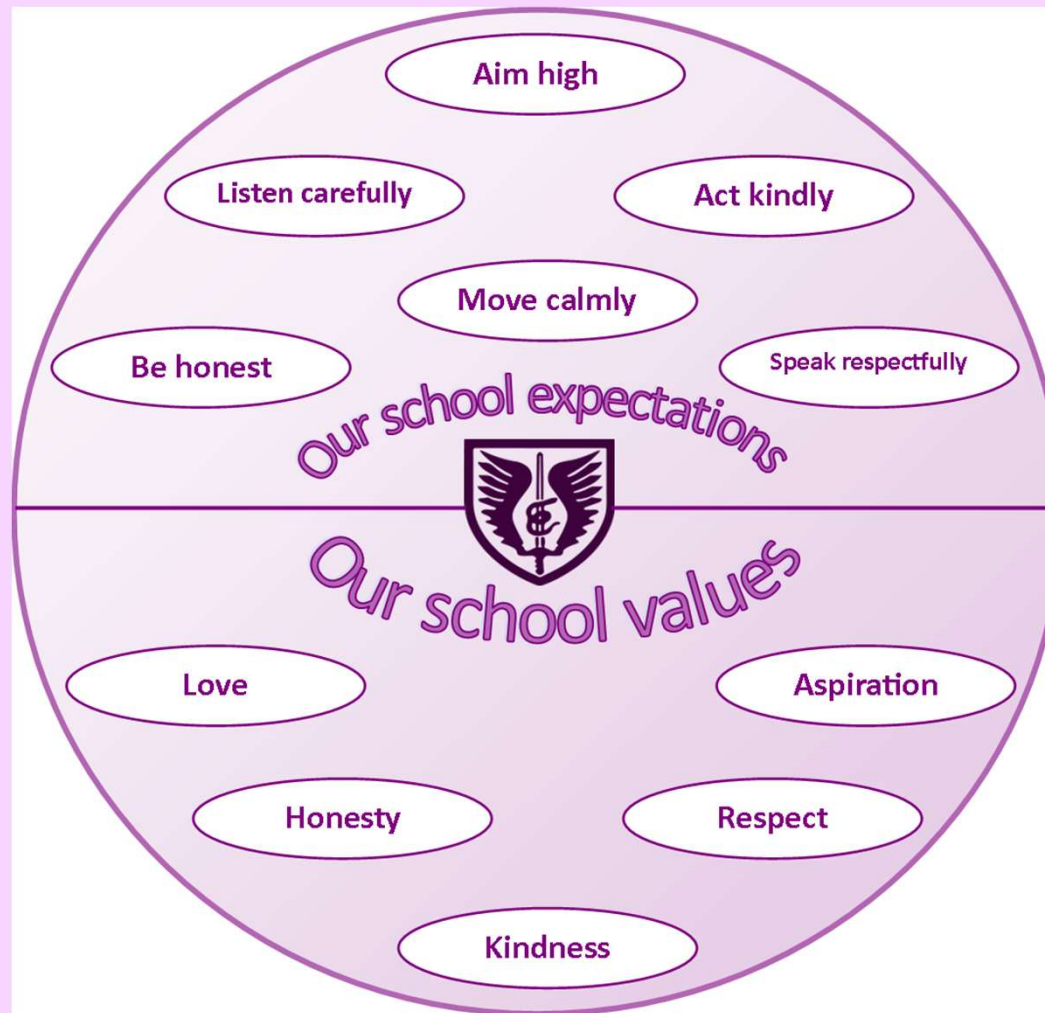

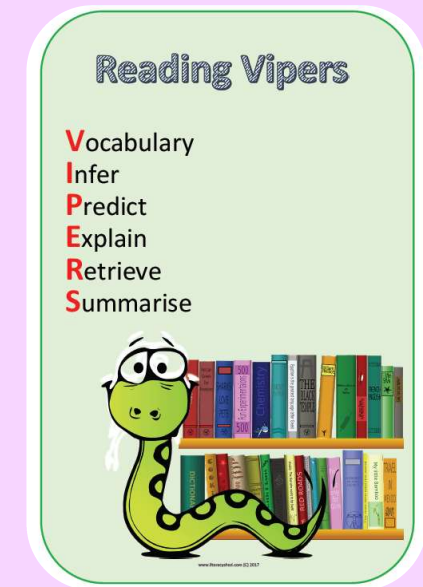
How to help at home

- Make sure your children arrive at school: on time, well rested, fed and ready for a day of learning.
- Encourage learning of number bonds and times tables and use real life examples to support this, for example when shopping or preparing meals.
- Support your children with their home learning through regular practice and encouraging them to take the lead.
- Take time to play and relax with your children. We work them hard during the day and time to play and be together is one of most invaluable learning opportunities you can provide.

How to help with reading at home

- Read to and with your child. Encourage a love of reading and create spaces for children to enjoy reading, sharing and comparing books.
- Listen to your child read often, particularly supporting in decoding unknown words, understanding new vocabulary and summarising what they have read.
- This is really important throughout a child's primary education, even when they are able to read independently.
- Ask questions using the VIPERS technique to check understanding.
- When working on sight vocabulary, flash cards are very useful.
- Please update your child's reading record at least weekly.
- Do not forget the power of reading to your child!



The Multiplication Tables Check

- All Y4 children in the country are expected to participate in the multiplication tables check in June.
- This is a statutory assessment. There is no *official* pass mark(!)
- The MTC lasts for around 5 minutes and takes place on an electronic device (usually a PC or Chromebook).
- The children are given 25 multiplication questions (no division) one after the other with a maximum of 6 seconds to answer.
- Results will be published in your child's school report.

- Please support your children in their preparation for this assessment – eg. regular times tables chanting at home and Times Tables Rockstars.
- We carry out daily multiplication tables activities – games, chanting, quizzes, races etc.
- We have a weekly test (Tuesdays), and will carry out a mock version of the MTC once a week (Friday). This helps the children learn through repetition and practice, while also helping them get used to the format of the real thing.

General Information, Equipment and Resources

- Ensure that children have the appropriate school uniform for the day and weather.
- Children are asked to have their P.E. kit in school every day.
 - plain black, grey, navy or purple clothing and dark trainers please – not white, heavily branded or team football kits.
- P.E days: Friday – if this changes, an email will be sent.
- Reading books to be brought in daily.
- Spellings daily.
- Times Tables Test – Tuesday.
- Water bottles daily. No fizzy or energy drinks.
- Bags – Only small bags/ book bags are needed. Pencil cases - please make sure they are small.
- KS2 pencil case – please make sure you review the Stationery List – handwriting pens in standard blue please

Please take a look at this short stationery guide which includes the items you will need for the start of the new school year. Please ensure each item is named or initialled as this will help items from becoming lost. If and when items need replacing, we will send Dojo messages to let you know.

Bags, Folders and Pencil Case Guidance

You will need a pencil case large enough to contain the items below in, but this does not need to be too large! A plain coloured or translucent, flexible plastic-style pencil case is sufficient.

Be realistic about the size of the bag you bring in to school as our cloakrooms are restricted! You only need a bag big enough for your pencil case (which could stay in your tray), lunch, a water bottle and an A4 plastic folder to hold your reading record and book.

Whilst bags and pencil cases from stores such as Smiggle look attractive, they are very expensive, large and take up a lot of desk space. Please avoid pencil cases from stores such as this and avoid large pencil cases with multiple pop-out or zipped storage areas.

✗ What Not to Bring In

Some items, such as these below, we will provide for you. For safety, and due to severe latex and rubber allergies we have in school, you must not bring in:

- Scissors
- Protractors
- Tippex/ Correction Fluid
- Calculators, as these are not required

✓ What You Should Bring In

Your pencil case should contain the following items, named or initialled:

- Plain Colour or Translucent Standard Pencil Case
- HB Writing Pencils
- Blue Ink Handwriting Pens (see examples and note)
- Glue Stick
- Black Ink Whiteboard/ Dry wipe Pens
- 30cm Ruler (or folding version)
- Sharpener
- Purple Ink Pens
- Colouring Pencils*
- Yellow and Green Highlighter
- You should also have an A4 plastic folder to hold your Reading Record, Reading Book and Home Learning in. Letters can also come to and from school in this.

*You may want to bring in a separate set of colouring pens in your bag, but you do not need to bring them into the classroom as we have class sets.

Cost Estimate

Based on prices for similar items on Amazon (as of 20/6/2024 and assuming free Prime delivery), the total cost for a pencil case and all of the above contents was between £10-15. However, it is worth noting that many supermarkets such as Tesco and high street chains such as WHSmith will often run price promotions during the summer for 'Back to School'.

* The above are examples as recommended by occupational therapists and practitioners of the National Handwriting Association – please feel free to explore blue pens that work for your child, however try to avoid standard, thin blue biro's as these do not always promote correct posture and coordination in the hand and arm conducive to fluent, legible handwriting at speed.
